

Shri Anil Swarup is presently posted as Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Government of India.

Before this assignment, in his capacity as Secretary, Ministry of Coal, he was instrumental in carrying out the auction of coal blocks that is likely to result in a revenue flow of around Rs. 3 Lakh Crore to the States. The initiatives taken by him resulted in record production of coal in the country. This production helped in tiding over the crisis created by coal shortages.

Shri Anil Swarup started his career in the Indian Administrative Service (IAS) in, 1981. His past assignments in various Ministries of the Government reflect his in-depth knowledge and experience in visualizing, conceptualizing, articulating and implementing various schemes.

Shri Swarup holds a Masters degree in Political Science from Allahabad University, where he was awarded the Chancellor's Gold medal for the best all-round student. At the very beginning of his administrative career he was awarded the Best officer Award at Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration amongst the officers of 1981 batch. As a strategic thinker and an innovative leader he has won several awards and nomination, the prominent ones being: Nominated as one of the "policy change agent" by The Economics Times during the years 2010, 2012, 2015 & 2016. He was selected as one of the 35 "Action Heroes" in India Today's 35th Annual Edition.

He has worked with UNICEF, where he handled a Primary Education Enhancement Programme for two districts in Maharashtra. Launch of the Funding Education with Impact Report

'Funding Education with Impact – A guide for social investment in India' is AVPN's latest analysis on actionable investment opportunities in education in India. Developed in partnership with Credit Suisse and Sattva, the guide provides an overview of the current landscape in education by life stages of a student from 3-18 years old.

From there, it dives deeper into pertinent gaps, successful interventions and social purpose organisations (SPOs), and investment models and investment opportunities in early childhood, primary, secondary, vocational and inclusive education as well as ecosystem opportunities.

Accounting for the CSR law, the guide outlines the SPOs by their registration and business model as non-profit, social enterprise and hybrid. The guide also helps identify investment opportunities and aims to enable a more strategic deployment of social investing capital to solve social causes in education.

#4 – Addressing and Supporting Equitable Inclusive Education

In 2014, an estimated 2.14 million children in the age group of 6-13 years were characterized as children with special needs in India. However, there is a remarkable paucity of data and research around the educational and social outcomes for these children.

This session will review the role that funders can play collectively in shaping the interventions around education for children with special needs. Emphasis will be placed on re-defining ways to foster social inclusion and employability, which had deep implications to the provision of quality education for these children.

Key Takeaways:

- The discussion on access to education needs to include alleviation of attitudinal barriers, customized pedagogy, trained teachers and counsellors.
- Measuring impact of educational interventions to include educational outcomes, social inclusion by peers and the broader school community.
- Urgent need for all stakeholders and funders in the education space to focus on how children with special needs can effectively participate in the labour market.






